Becca has worked with young people in a range of settings, including schools, community youth groups, and under the umbrella of CAMHS and social services.

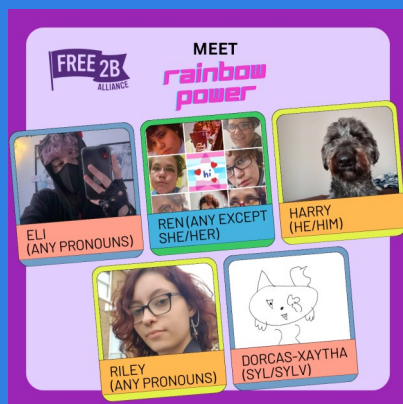

We're so excited to have Becca on board and can't wait to see the positive impact they'll have at Free2B!



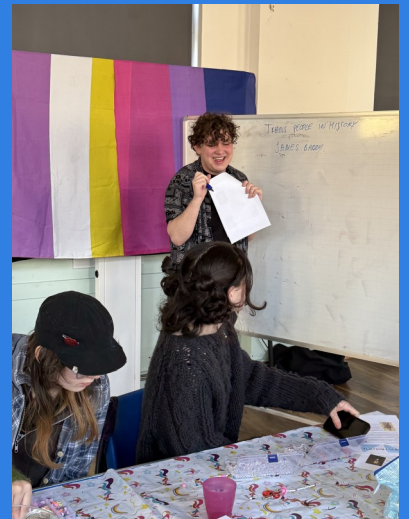

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YOUNG PEOPLE

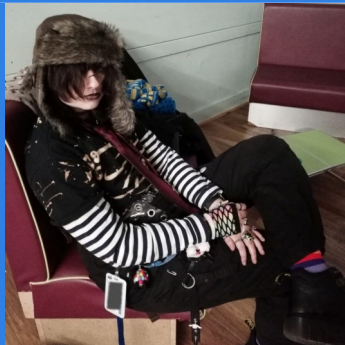

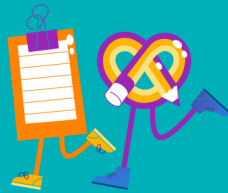


SAVE THE DATE!
